

Asker Husain is a barrister. He started his prosecutorial career in 1989, when he joined the Crown Prosecution Service (CPS). He worked in various offices in CPS London and 1997 saw him join the Central Casework section of CPS Headquarters, in London, where he prosecuted terrorist, race hatred, serious fraud, corporate manslaughter and Official Secrets Act cases, before being promoted in 1999 to head up the Casework Directorate in York.

Seconded to the Attorney General's chambers from 2001 to 2004, Asker gained experience of the workings of government and Whitehall and advised the Law Officers in respect of policy and casework, including corruption, human trafficking and ULSs. He also accompanied them when they visited various CPS and other prosecuting agencies' offices across the country, giving him an insight in the workings and practices of CPS offices across England and Wales.

From 2005 as Head of the Special Crime Unit, his personal caseload included prosecutions arising from the Hatfield and Ladbrook Grove train crashes, and advising the police on allegations related to Cash for Honours.
